Syllabus for FALL 2009 FLUTE LESSONS FOR MUSIC PERFORMANCE MAJORS (MUP 214 - LEC 5989 and LEC 8978)

Course Description:

Flute lessons are taken on an individual and weekly basis with Dr. Danilo Mezzadri. Auditions are required for initial placement. Duration of lesson will depend on the number of credits registered (i.e. (1) credit = 1/2 hour lesson, (2) and (3) credits = 1 hour lesson). Music Performance Majors typically register for 3 credits each semester.

Required Materials:

The student must have a flute, a metronome, and a tuner, all in working condition.

The student must bring a notebook to classes.

Required Text:

Course Goal and Objectives:

The goal of lessons is to develop all aspects of the flutist's art: Musical interpretation, repertoire, technique, physical awareness, pedagogy and learning processes, and performance. Lessons will concentrate on the individual needs of the student, and regardless of academic major, all students will be responsible for a high standard of preparation, performance, participation, and professional conduct. During the lesson time, the achievement of the following objectives are expected from the student:

1-To perform the studio scale patterns at a minimum speed of quarter note equals 100 beats/second for freshman and 120 beats/second for sophomores. The studio scale pattern must be performed by memory. The student has a total of three attempts to achieve this objective during his/her lesson time. This objective will be measured by accuracy of articulation and speed stability.

2-To perform the studio 8-chords progression chart at a minimum speed of quarter note equals 100 beats/second for freshman and 120 beats/second for sophomores. The studio chord progression must be performed by memory. This objective will be measured by accuracy of performance and intonation.

3-To perform at least one new assigned etude per lesson. Performance of the etude will be measured by accuracy of performance (50%), intonation (30%), and musicality (20%). A performance is considered accurate when it reflects the rhythms, notes, articulations, and dynamics written in the part.

4-To perform any specifically assigned exercise. This objective will be measured by technical improvement (50%) and intonation (50%).

5-To perform any previously assigned repertoire for the semester. This objective will be measured by technical improvement (20%), accuracy of performance (30%), intonation (30%), and musicality (20%).



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Attendance Policy:

Lesson attendance and promptness directly affect the student's grade. An unexcused absence is equivalent to failing that lesson and will be reflected in semester grading. Absence from any lesson will be excused for illness, family emergency, or other USM School of Music events only.

When possible, every effort should be made by the student to notify Dr. Mezzadri personally, a minimum of 24 hours in advance. When canceled by the instructor, a make-up time will be provided. The instructor, however, is under no obligation to wait for tardy students or provide make-up times for lessons, which are canceled by the student.

Students are asked to trade lesson times with other studio members before contacting the teacher.

Students should be warmed up and ready to play at their lesson time. Excessive or continual tardiness will result in grade reduction. Dr. Mezzadri reserves the right to dismiss any student who is unprepared for his/her lesson according to studio standards. The student will be given a failing grade for that lesson. This will be reflected in the final semester grade. Students are expected to attend class each time the class meets.

Scheduling:

When scheduling a rehearsal or lesson outside of the student's regular lesson time, such as a chamber music rehearsal, dress rehearsal for a recital, make-up lesson etc., students must notify Dr. Mezzadri **IN WRITING** one week in advance.

Physical Contact:

Normal instruction in flute performance involves a certain amount of limited and gender-neutral physical contact between the teacher and student when dealing with subjects such as breathing, posture, finger/hand position, tension, musical performance techniques, etc. It is the responsibility of any student who is in any way at any time uncomfortable with this gender-neutral physical contact to immediately inform the teacher of that discomfort.

Juries:

Music Performance Majors are required to perform in the academic juries, except when performing a recital in the same semester. During the academic jury, the student must perform a significant movement of a major composition studied during the semester and scales at a speed commensurate with their level. Juries are scheduled for 12/09/09 from 1 pm to 7 pm.

Sophomore Proficiency Jury:

At the end of their fourth semester in MUP 214, students are required to take the Sophomore Proficiency Jury. During this jury, the student must successfully complete the following five activities:

1-Perform any major or minor scales using the Southern Miss Flute Studio scale patterns at a minimum speed of quarter note equals 120 beats/second.

2-perform any part of Reichert's *Seven Daily Exercises*.

3-perform a movement of a major work of the flute repertoire accompanied by piano

4-perform a solo etude chosen by Dr. Mezzadri two weeks prior to the jury.

5-Give a five minutes lecture on three topics chosen by the jury committee. The jury committee will chose the topics from a list of 10 possible topics provided to the student by Dr. Mezzadri by 10/10/2009.

Written Requirements:

Students are required to maintain a notebook of written comments by the instructor.

Grading:

Grading for the lessons will be based upon the achievement of the previously described objectives.
